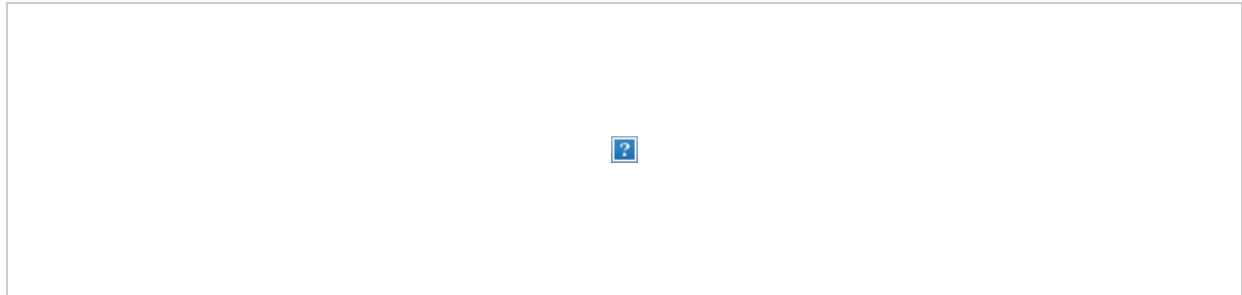

The U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) concludes that the evidence is insufficient to recommend for or against routine screening for dementia in older adults. I recommendation. There is no evidence that routine screening in a primary care setting helps diagnose early Alzheimer's and cognitive testing is recommended when signs of deterioration are detected by the clinical team or family member. I would recommend that this not be included.
