- Strengthen Program Quality Metrics: Incorporate measures that reflect family engagement, cultural responsiveness, and social-emotional development outcomes.
- Support Real-Time Data Access: Enhance data systems to enable local programs to access their data promptly, facilitating data-driven decision-making at the community level.
- Streamline Reporting Burdens: Explore ways to align PIR reporting with other federal or state data collection requirements to minimize administrative burden on Head Start programs.

I appreciate the opportunity to provide input and encourage OHS to continue engaging with program leaders, researchers, and families to ensure the data collected is meaningful, actionable, and aligned with the evolving needs of Head Start communities.
