

Measure Stratification

Instructions

Enter data below to stratify this measure by race, ethnicity, sex, and/or geography. Beginning with 2025 Core Sets reporting, states are required to report stratified data for a specific subset of Child, Adult, and Health Home Core Set measures. For 2025 Core Sets reporting, states have the option to stratify race and ethnicity data using either (1) the [1997 Office of Management and Budget \(OMB\) minimum race and ethnicity categories](#), as specified in the [2011 HHS standards](#), or (2) the [Statistical Policy Directive #15: 2024 OMB race and ethnicity standards](#) for each measure selected for stratification.

CMS recognizes that stratifying data could result in small cell sizes. CMS encourages states to report data in the QMR system for measures and rates with small cell sizes. For the purpose of public reporting, data will be suppressed in accordance with the CMS cell-size suppression policy, which prohibits the direct reporting of beneficiary and record counts of 1 to 10 and values from which users can derive values of 1 to 10. Furthermore, CMS will suppress rates with a denominator less than 30 due to reliability concerns.
