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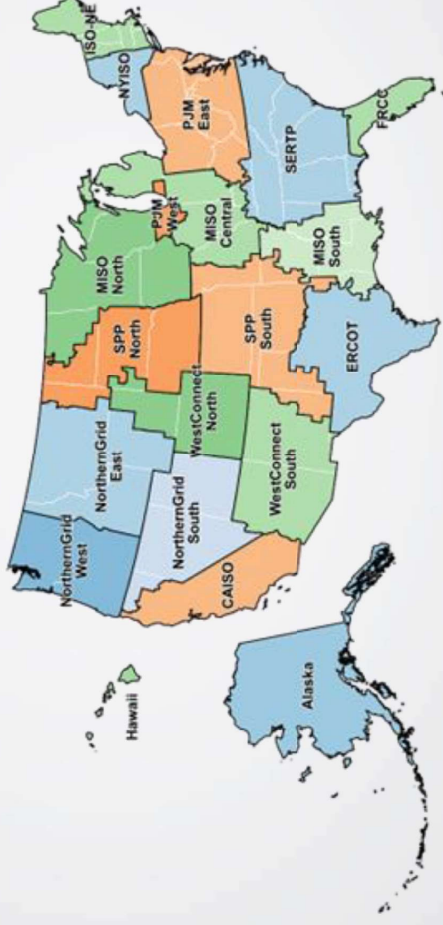

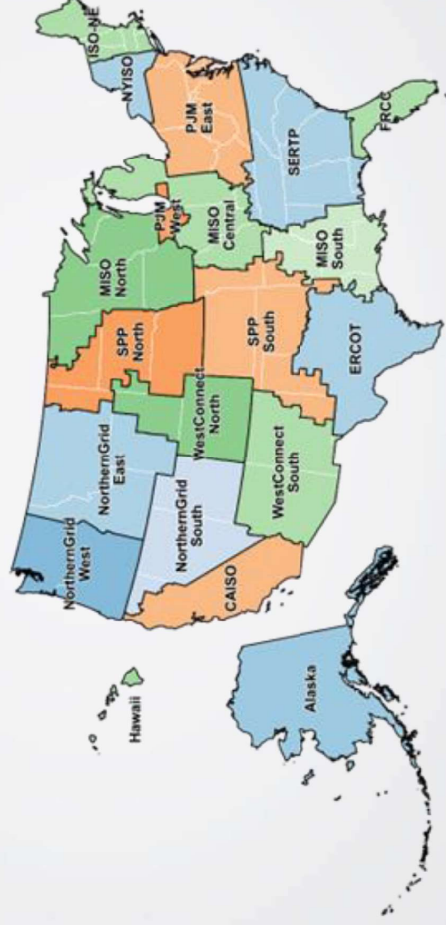
1. Click on the map which region you are most familiar with and/or focused on.
