Dear Reports Liaison Officer:

The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for the American Housing Survey (AHS). The data collected on this form are crucial to key components of BEA's economic statistics.

Data from the AHS are used in the national income and product accounts (NIPA) to prepare the nonfarm housing services estimate which is a component of personal consumption expenditures in the gross domestic product. AHS data are also used to prepare the rental income of persons estimate which is a property income measure related to the provision of housing services in national and personal income. Rental income of persons is calculated using the estimates of nonfarm housing services, as well as estimates of condominium, cooperative housing, and property management fees; all based on AHS data.

Subsequently, these NIPA estimates are used for the BEA's industry benchmark and annual input-output accounts. Additionally, BEA's regional economic accounts plan to use the AHS to compare rent data with the Census Bureau's American Community Survey. A list of items currently used is found in the attachment.

Please keep BEA informed about any modifications to this survey. We are particularly interested in any modifications proposed during the survey approval process that would substantially affect our use of these data.
