This will not be true of financial advisors, trust companies, fund companies, attorneys or the record keepers.

I am obviously not opposed to our information being provided to either the IRS or the DOL. In fact, I think many in my industry already assumed that information was somehow being passed through the EFAST2 filing.

Instead of making my client list a matter of public record, may I please suggest that a solution be found with the vendors whereas our information is passed through the EFAST2 filing as meta data? That way my client list remains confidential and the IRS or DOL has the necessary information needed.
