## **XI. NWOS Wildfire Science Module**

**Wildfire** is an unplanned fire that starts in forestland, woodland, or rangeland. It can be started by lightning or by people, either accidentally or intentionally.

**Prescribed fire** is a burn set by professionals on forestland, woodland, or rangeland under strict guidelines. Prescribed fire is used to prevent build-ups of flammable woody materials that could cause intense wildfires.
