The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data by the U.S. Department of Labor for the National Agricultural Workers Survey. This survey is our main data source for key components of BEA's economic statistics.

Data from the National Agricultural Workers Survey (NAWS) have been used since 1997 by the BEA for estimates in the international transactions accounts and gross domestic income. Specifically, BEA estimates compensation of undocumented immigrant agricultural workers using the following variables: the percentage of farm workers that are migratory; the percentage of these migratory workers who are undocumented immigrants; the average number of weeks worked per year by these migratory workers; and their average hours worked per week. Also, the number of undocumented immigrant workers, who are calculated in this methodology, is important to our estimate of the compensation of undocumented nonagricultural workers.

The compensation of undocumented immigrant workers accounts for over 50 percent of our estimate of compensation of employees in the international transactions accounts. Compensation of employees' payments amounted to \$16.3 billion in 2014. These payments are part of total payments to the rest of the world, an important component in the estimation of gross domestic income.

These data are not obtainable elsewhere and are indispensable to our estimates. Our compensation estimates compose an ongoing time series. The reportedly large increases of undocumented immigrant workers in the United States make the continual updating of our data vitally important. The data used and how they are used by BEA can be found in the attachment.
