Bernie,

Thank you for providing the opportunity to comment.

As a Licensing Engineer representing a certificate holder company, I have reviewed the supporting statement for the information collection and the tally spreadsheet regarding 10 CFR Part 71.

1. The proposed collection of information is necessary as these sections are the regulatory requirements to protect the environment, public health and safety, and security with respect to the safe packaging and transportation of radioactive materials through the U.S. The NRC would not be able to properly and practically function; these are the requirements and this is the effort to review for completeness, accuracy, and comply with the regulations.
2. The accuracy of the burden estimate tasks and hours, based on the review of the supporting statement descriptions and spreadsheet, as well as my knowledge and skill as a professional engineer and estimator, is reasonable and accurate.
3. The quality, utility, and clarity appear to be reasonable. I do not see the need for any enhancements at this time.
4. Although not knowing any details regarding the current collection techniques, my recommendation would be to review how various industries utilize automated collection techniques for possible enhancements to the NRC's current collection techniques.
