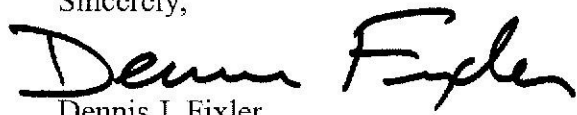
The Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) strongly supports the continued collection of data on Form SHLA/SHL. The data collected on these forms are crucial to key components of BEA's economic statistics.

Annual and benchmark reports on foreign residents' holdings of U.S. securities are used directly in compiling estimates for BEA's International Investment Position (IIP). Specifically, these reports contribute to estimates on several lines of IIP Table 1 and Table 2, including lines 36-39 (U.S. Treasury securities, and U.S. securities other than U.S. Treasury securities).

In addition, these reports serve as a check on quarterly estimates and as a guideline to annual revisions of those estimates in BEA's International Transactions Accounts (ITAs). Specifically, these reports impact estimates on several lines of ITA Table 1, including lines 65 and 66 (U.S. Treasury securities, and U.S. securities other than U.S. Treasury securities) and line 32 (Other private payments), as well as estimates in Sections B and C of ITA Table 7.

Please keep BEA informed about any modifications to these forms. We are particularly interested in any modifications proposed during the form's approval process that would substantially affect our use of these data.
