WISCONSIN PROPOSED COMMENTS

A) Is the proposed collection of information necessary for the proper performance of the function of the agency, including whether the information shall have practical utility?

Yes, Wisconsin believes the data collection is necessary and does have practical utility.

B) The accuracy of the agency's estimate of the burden of the proposed collection of information.

Wisconsin's preparation and submission of the OCSE-157 report does not create a burden that goes beyond the 7-hour estimate. Wisconsin finds the estimated amount of burden hours to be accurate.

C) The quality, utility and clarity of the information to be collected

Yes, Wisconsin finds the OCSE-157 data collection to be clear and accurate. The FFY2015 Data Reliability Audit of the OCSE-157 showed Wisconsin to have reliable and accurate data.

D) Ways to minimize the burden of the collection of information on respondents, including using automated collection techniques or other forms of information technology.

Wisconsin uses automated collection techniques for the OCSE-157 data collection.

Wisconsin would like to note, that with the anticipated changes in the OCSE-157 form and instruction for FFY 2018, Wisconsin potentially could be looking at a significant increase for time spent gathering the needed data, but that will be dependent upon the implementation of the anticipated changes.
