The opposition in Nevada to Yucca Mountain does not seem to be based on a technical, economic, or societal analysis but rather on strongly held political views that reject any rational discussions on the topic.

I know many people in the Las Vegas area and have found that the opposition to Yucca Mountain is NOT unanimous by a long shot. There are many people who support the project that have taken the time to understand the impact on Nevada.

I believe that Yucca Mountain should be a win-win situation for Nevada and the rest of our nation, if the plan involves providing Nevada with benefits that affect every citizen. There is an opportunity to provide economic, educational benefits, and R&D benefits to Nevada that would make the risks balanced against these benefits.
