Production Revenue Accounting issues the EIA-914, but I can tell you that we currently are not running our fluids through any stabilizing vessels downstream of the heater treater, mainly because the liquids we produce fall within the RVP limits.

If that RVP rule changes in the future, we may have to look at modifying our facilities in some fields but until then, this change to form 914 should not affect us.
