
The referenced determination was not revalidated when the maps were updated in 2014. This means that the flood hazard information shown on the updated map has changed and the information in the case file for the previous determination was not sufficient to allow for revalidation of the determination. This appears to be because the Base Flood Elevation for the area of your property has increased based on the 2014 study update. If you would like us to issue a new determination to clarify the status of the property, I can direct our amendment contractor to start that process. But please let me know if you wish to make such a request.
