This survey is about your expenses associated with snorkeling and diving on reefs in Hawaii. In the survey the term 'reefs' refers to coral reefs that occur naturally in Hawaii and artificial reefs (such as sunken boats, planes, or other man-made substrates that attract marine life).

In the survey you can hover over any text in blue for an explanation of the term.

The term 'trip' simply means the last time you went diving or snorkeling on a Hawaiian coral reef, regardless of how long you spent diving or snorkeling. A trip could be a paid excursion, diving or snorkeling from a private boat or a rented boat, or diving or snorkeling from shore.
