## General Comment

### Questions:

1. Will the FNS 905 mirror the current FNS 543a? the data collection described on page 3, 1st paragraph is very vague. SA have already spent significant resources to automate the process of the 543a. It is not clear why the 543 cannot continue as is. The SA provides this information, not local organizations.
2. Will the FNS 905 be on a cycle or same cycle as current FNS543a for submission? If so it is not noted in the proposed information collection.
3. The proposed information collection for the FNS 905 indicated it will only be Approved sites? Currently 543a can be populated by all sites not in error, however we only submit approved.

### Comments:

- a. We believe the information is valuable to the public.
- b. Summer locations, serving days and meal times change from day to day, more frequent updates of the FNS 509 information would enhance the site finder for the end user, however it would also increase the SA burden of having to upload the information more frequently.

The information is only as accurate as the sponsor provides until the SA validates during a review or monitoring visits.

c. some sites operate for a very limited time. public report is often behind, only due to the speed of the program and sometimes very short windows of operation. Making it easy for families to decipher if a site is operating for the time period they are looking and the meal service they are looking for.

d. Like the FNS 543a, the information required for the FNS 905 will be set to automatically be extracted from our software system so the SA burden is minimal for providing the information. We suggest it mirror to the extent possible, the 543a to reduce additional development costs.
