Below are comments submitted in response to a proposed rule (Agency/Docket Number: USCBP-2018-0029) published by U.S. Customs and Border Protection and Treasury Department on 08/02/2018 concerning Modernized Drawback. Our company is one of the oldest continuously operating duty drawback specialists in the U.S., with hundreds of clients claiming all types of drawback.

One of the purposes for the Trade Facilitation and Trade Enforcement Act was to simplify the burden of work for the trade and for CBP. Before the introduction of ACE, a significant amount of time was spent completing each form required for a drawback claim. Given that other CBP forms are no longer necessary to submit with the transmission of the electronic claim (CBP Forms 7551, 7552 and 7514), it would make sense to continue with the efforts to align with the Paper Reduction Act to also eliminate CBP Form 7553.

We believe that changes to the regulations would be required in §§§190.35, 190.42 and 190.71 to account for the removal of this form.
