Thank you for allowing us a chance to submit comments on this matter. My name is Alex Cracchiolo, and I am submitting this comment on behalf of USA Farm Labor, Inc., an agency that specializes in helping farmers use the H-2A Program. We wish to discuss the requirement to enter the petitioner's address, rather than the address of an agent, in the mailing address fields on page 1 of the I-129.

As an agent, we have been entering our address in the mailing address fields so that RFEs and other correspondence come directly to us, saving our clients time and work. This is the common practice among agents in this industry. We handle RFEs and submit responses on behalf of our clients, so having those notices go to our clients would only cause delays and potentially leave us out of the loop. This requirement would, therefore, be a huge inconvenience to our clients, our company, and other agencies in our industry.

We therefore request that a space for an agents mailing address be included in addition to the space for the petitioners address, and that all correspondence from the USCIS be sent to the agent if that section is filled out.
