I am a mid-20's woman serving my country in a second year of AmeriCorps service, and I use SNAP to be able to afford this service while being placed in a high-rent city that I otherwise could not afford to serve in. I have a few thousand dollars as an emergency fund, which would only pay my rent for a few months should anything happen to my living stipend. The thought that I am being encouraged to spend down my savings in order to afford food while serving my country full time is heart breaking. This does not reflect American values.
