key messages

- Now is not the time to place roadblocks in the way of families receiving lifesaving benefits. With hunger and unemployment skyrocketing in the wake of COVID-19, more families are in need of the support of our safety-net and states are already stretched thin in their capacity to administer benefits.
- This proposed rule change does not remedy any actual deficiencies in the program, but causes damage to the established nutrition safety net in America.
- No evidence suggests that Cat-El has been abused by SNAP applicants, or resulted in fraud, or provided public benefits to undeserving individuals and families.
- USDA's own estimate is that this proposed rule change would result in 3.1 million people losing critically-needed SNAP benefits. The people bearing the most impact will be the most vulnerable SNAP recipients including seniors, people with disabilities, and the working poor.
- This proposed rule change against SNAP is contrary to congressional intent as laid out in the 2018 bipartisan Farm Bill, It is out of touch with the reality of struggling American workers, veterans, military families, and even farmers.
- We remind you that USDA's motto is to "do right and feed everyone". You can do that by protecting the vulnerable and helping those in need.
