- Dareltech LLC (“Dareltech”) is a Maryland-based, thought-driven inventor-owned start-up company active in the creative design, engineering, manufacturing and commercialization of inventive and impactful products, many of which have achieved wide global recognition and commercial success.
- Our philosophy is to develop unique and useful products and applications that make us happy, comfortable, and in control of the machines we use, to enhance our overall interactive and viewing experience.

Power Management Patents (“FS”) - US8,593,427; US8,717,328; US9,075,612; and US9,360,9231

- The FS disclose & claim methods, systems, & devices for managing power consumption by adjusting the visual display of an electronic device by turning certain portions of the OLED screen off (turning the pixels to black).
- Dareltech team visited Samsung in Seoul for meetings regarding FS’s patented technology. Samsung officially invited Dareltech and then stole their inventions.
- Infringing products include the ubiquitous Ultra Power Saving Mode introduced by Samsung in February 2014, or a version thereof, included in over 1 billion devices.
- EDT Case No. 4:18-cv-00702-ALM for willful infringement complaint filed by Dareltech against Samsung on 10/4/2018.
- IPRs 2019-01528/01529/01575 filed by Samsung against Dareltech.
- PTAB institutes all 3 IPRs. Dareltech was forced to settle with Samsung.
- “Settlement and License Agreement” with Samsung executed on 8/25/2020.
- Samsung is a \$ multi-billion multinational and the largest smartphone company in the world. Samsung manufactures 90% of the world’s OLED displays. Importantly, Samsung has a 90+ kill rate at the PTAB.

The Selfie Stick Patents (“Selfie Sticks”)- US9,037,128; 9,055,144; 9,503,627; and 9,571,716 (1/2)

- The Selfie Sticks disclose and claim methods, systems, and devices for providing a wireless connection that allows a user to actuate a control button on the handle of a stick to operate a smartphone’s camera feature.
- Dareltech engineered, designed, tested, and manufactured 11,500 units of at a cost of \$322,000. Before Dareltech could get a foothold in the market, cheap similar infringing products flooded the market, most if not all were made in China.
- Infringing products include every selfie stick device currently on the market or which have previously sold since 2013, numbering over 500 million pieces to date.
- EDNY Case 1:18-cv-08873-AKH - willful infringement complaint filed against DJI.
- 6 IPRs (2019-0716/0717/0719/0721/0722/0723) filed by DJI against Dareltech.
- PTAB institutes for all 6 IPRs. Dareltech was forced to settle with DJI.
- DJI is a “privately” held Chinese multinational and the world’s largest drone manufacturer, controlling 78% of the US market. Why did DJI turn down Apple’s lucrative cash purchase offer in 2017? Simple, because the Chinese government does not need cash, it needs data.

The Selfie Stick Patents (“Selfie Sticks”)- US9,037,128; 9,055,144; 9,503,627; and 9,571,716 (2/2)

- EDNY Case 1:18-cv-08729AKH - willful infringement complaint filed against Xiaomi.
- Xiaomi argued that the Court did not have jurisdiction.
- Judge agreed with Xiaomi and dismissed the case without prejudice, but denied Xiaomi’s motion for attorney fees for \$735,000 (Case Doc 99 filed 9/10/2019).
- Xiaomi solicits Microsoft to the Rescue. IPR2020-01575 filed by Microsoft against Dareltech on 2/3/2020, listing Xiaomi as a real party of interest.
- Decision instituting the IPR on 9/16/2020. Settlement offer received within a few hours.
- Microsoft is a \$trillion company with a 90+ kill rate at the PTAB. Microsoft does not infringe any Dareltech patent claims. The two have no legal dispute and there can be no district court suit between them. Incredibly, Microsoft stated that the IPR was filed at Xiaomi’s request pursuant to their “strategic cooperation”.
- Facts & videos uncovered by Dareltech clearly demonstrate that Xiaomi – a Chinese \$ billion company - has been doing business in the US in what their employees call “a secret operation”, and that their US Director perjured himself. Due to its covert activity in the US, Xiaomi has been able to avoid liability for infringing U.S. intellectual property. As such, Xiaomi has been free riding on American innovation for years.
