Unified Agenda of Federal Regulatory Actions

AGENCY: Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board.

ACTION: Semiannual regulatory agenda.

SUMMARY: The Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board (Board), in accordance with the requirements of the Regulatory Flexibility Act, is publishing a semiannual agenda of rulemakings that the Board expects to propose or promulgate over the next year.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Regulatory Flexibility Act (RFA), 5 U.S.C. 601, et seq., includes a requirement that each agency publish semiannually in the Federal Register a regulatory flexibility agenda. Such agendas are to contain the following elements, as specified in 5 U.S.C. 602(a):

- 1. A brief description of the subject area of any rule that the agency expects to propose or promulgate;
- 2. A summary of the nature of any such rule under consideration for each subject area listed in the agenda, the objectives and legal basis for the issuance of the rule, and an approximate schedule for completing action on any rule for which the agency has issued a general notice of proposed rulemaking; and
- 3. The name and telephone number of an agency official knowledgeable about the items listed in the agenda. Accordingly, the Board has prepared an agenda with one rulemaking that it presently expects will be considered and adopted by February 3, 2020. The listing of the rule in this regulatory flexibility agenda should not be taken as a determination that the rule, when proposed or promulgated, will in fact require a regulatory flexibility analysis. Rather, the Board has chosen to publish an agenda that includes the rule, regardless of its potential impact on small entities, to provide the public with broader notice of the rule and to enhance the public's opportunity to participate in

the rulemaking process.

The Board's fall 2019 regulatory flexibility agenda is included in the Unified Agenda of

Federal Regulatory and Deregulatory Actions. The complete Unified Agenda will be available

online at www.reginfo.gov in a format that offers users enhanced ability to obtain information

from the Agenda database.
