Regulatory Agenda

AGENCY: Peace Corps.

ACTION: Advanced notice of proposed rulemaking.

SUMMARY: The purpose of publishing this agenda is to give notice of any regulatory activity by the Peace Corps in order to allow the public an opportunity to participate in the rulemaking process.

DATES: This agenda announces the regulations the Peace Corps will have under development during the 12-month period beginning in June of 2025 through May of 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: In accordance with Executive Order 12866 entitled "Regulatory Planning and Review" and the Regulatory Flexibility Act, 5 U.S.C. 601 to 612, executive agencies are required to publish in the **Federal Register** semiannual regulatory agendas each year. Some being considered by the Peace Corps may be "significant" rules within the meaning of Executive Order 12866. In addition, the Peace Corps has determined, under the Regulatory Flexibility Act, that the regulations under consideration will not have a significant economic impact on a substantial number of small entities. Accordingly, no Regulatory Flexibility Analysis is required. The agency is seeking to amend 22 CFR 305 *Eligibility and Standards for Peace Corps Volunteer Service* to be in compliance with Executive Orders 14151, 14168, and 14219 and 22 CFR 306 *Volunteer Discrimination Complaint Procedure* to be in compliance with Executive Orders 14151 and 14219. The agency is also reviewing 22 CFR 308 *Implementation of The Privacy Act of 1974* to determine appropriate revisions.
