SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP), a component of the Executive Office of the President, was established by the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988 (Pub. L. 100-690) and is responsible for coordinating Federal drug control policy and administering grant programs that support national drug control efforts.

This Agenda presents the rulemaking activity that the ONDCP currently expects to undertake. ONDCP is proposing companion revisions to the Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) proposed updates to Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Subtitle A Office of Management and Budget Guidance for Federal Financial Assistance. Consistent with the review requirements in 2 C.F.R. 200.109, the intent of these proposed revisions in Subtitle B Federal Agency Regulations for Grants and Agreements is to improve transparency, accountability, and oversight for Federal awards across the Federal Government by ensuring continued alignment

with Administration priorities, revising indirect cost policy, reducing burden, and converting guidance to regulation.

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
